Results of Bylaw Amendment Voting

Between Auugust 1 and August 15, 2025 alumni initiates were requested to consider amending the Alumni Bylaws.

According to Bylaws Article X Section B: Any amendments to the Bylaws shall require an affirmative vote of two-thirds of those voting.

The amendment was to amend Article VI, Section B adjusting the latest date to elect new Board Officers from May 1 to May 15 of each year.

The results of the balloting was as follows:

- 95.24 % in favor of the change
- 4.76 % opposed to the change

The amendment was approved.

Foundations

There are many things we can point to in the history of the Zeta Alpha Chapter. This issue we would like to highlight two (2) of the unsung heros who were associated to the Zeta Alpha Chapter.

The first is Mrs. Mable Poe "Grandma" Blyth. In 1970, then recognized locally as a member of the Daughters of the Crossed Swords, in 1974 was recognized by Theta Chi Fraternity at the national level.

The story of Grandma Blyth begins when she was living on the "Blue House" with the "new" Theta Chi house just 2 doors down. Her daughter Deanne Roemer shared:

In the early 60's when fraternities were new to the campus, "some people were apalled" that they would be living in the community. Sometimes the townspeople felt threatened by the growth of the college.

But Grandma Blyth felt responsibity toward these young men. She armed herself with a "roaster pot full of cookies" she went to the Theta Chi house and introduced herself with, "I'm your new neighbor."

She then went one step further and explained to the brothers their responsibilities to the community. She did it in love and the brothers accepted it the same way.

From that point forward, one could find her photo in the chapter composits (which showed photos of each of the chapter brothers during that year,) and in yearbook photos.

Brothers who associated with Grandma Blyth benifited greatly. "She was the Grand Lady of Ettiquette." Brothers behaved in a more gentlemenly manner because of her influence.

In 1972, she was recognized with Slippery Rock Borough Town-Gown Award, that in 1976 became the Mable Blyth Town-Gown Award.


Additionally, the brothers of Theta Chi Fraternity even after they moved to Normal Avenue, regularly visited, helped with yard work, painting fences and generally taking care of the person who took care of us.

The second is Father John A. Conley. Father John served as the chapter advisor.


Father John, was responsible for the Neuman Center that is now known as St. Peter Parish & Campus Ministry the Rock Catholic Center at 342 Normal Avenue directly across the street from the "old" Theta Chi House on Normal Avenue.

Father John provided a guiding hand and was always ready to help the chapter in its campus efforts.

Though many of the brothers were known to go and "clonk" at the Neuman Center. Not so much a religious endeavor (though the services were utilized by the brothers) but the opportunity to use the pinball machines available! Some became expert by taking ash trays, placing them under the front legs dropping 25 cents and being able to play for hours!

Unfortuanetly, we have lost contact with Father John but his impact was felt as much as the support we received from Grandma Blyth. Though we do not have any quality individual photos of Father John we can share some Neuman center pictures from old yearbooks.







Brothers in the Spotlight



The brotherhood started at the Zeta Alpha Chapter of Theta Chi Fratenity can last a lifetime. It's hard for many younger brothers to imagine more than half the brothers that have been initiated into Zeta Alpha Chapter joined before there were cell phones, the internet, email or text messaging. The ability to stay connected with the brothers you pledged with, ate dinner with, and lived with after graduation was difficult.


Through the efforts of Brother Charles (Chuckie) Boylan 33 years ago (about 2 years after the chapter lost its charter) a connection to the lasting brotherhood was started. Chuckie went to the Alumni House at Slippery Rock and copied addresses of Brothers who had graduated before him as well as those that may have come after him and took time to hand write out and mail invitation post cards to the first golf outing.



From that first outing, a tradition has grown which has endured for 33 years helping reunite our brothers yearly. It is normally the same weekend in June before Father's Day (subject to facility

conflicts) and is a date brothers add to their calendars. At the same time, we understand that life goes on and wih graduations, weddings and other family related matters one cannot always attend but brothers are comforted by knowing, if they cannot come this year, they can make it the next year!

As the tradition grew and the internet and email became part of daily life, Brother Joe Suprano took on the tournament organization and communications.



Early in Joe's leadership he instituted a tradition, suggested to the brotherhood by Brother Dan Angelucci, of ordering memorial bricks to be placed together on the Slippery Rock Alumni House patio and raised the money by passing a coffee can around during the awards dinner after the golf outing.

A a point of interest, when the chapter was re-colonized in 2017, the event was held at he Alumni House and with the bricks just outside there was a special feeling that even those who had passed to the Chapter Eternal were able to be with us that day.

The money Joe collected started what today is the "Brick Fund" that continues this great tradition of honor at Slippery Rock's Alumni House. The Alumni Association is committed to honoring all brothers that pass on to the Chapter Eternal. We need the help of all our brothers by notifying the a member of the Alumni Board of the death of a brother and welcome donations to the fund.
